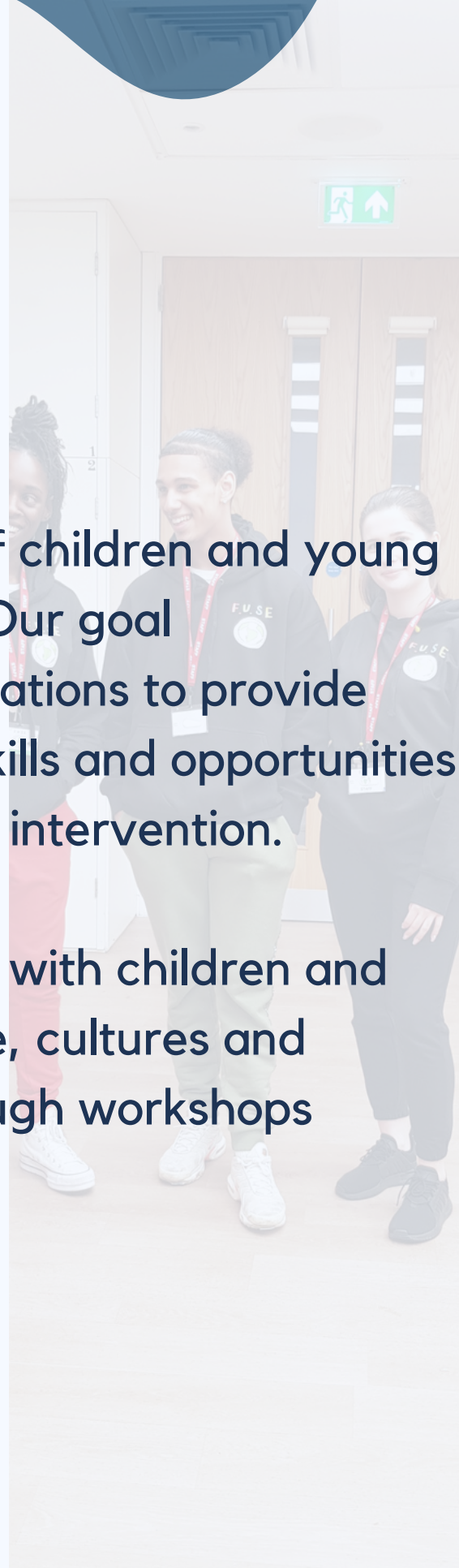

3. Organise and facilitate workshops, events, and sessions, ensuring they are inclusive, engaging, and meet the diverse needs of participants.
4. Establish and maintain partnerships with local service providers, schools, and community centres to broaden the reach of the project.
5. Conduct outreach to promote participation and ensure representation from various age groups within the community.
6. Implement effective data collection and evaluation processes to assess the impact of intergenerational activities.
7. Work closely with FUSE's team and management to refine and adapt initiatives based on feedback and outcomes.
8. Manage project budgets, resources, and reporting requirements.
9. Conduct focus groups and engage with young people to be able to develop the project based on their needs and feedback
10. Write comprehensive reports and case studies that adequately reflect the impact of the project
11. Attend training and meetings related to the project
