

Youth Worker Role

Summary

A youth club worker will be expected to guide and support young people in their personal and social development. Encouraging them to develop skills at youth club which can help them in society, skills which they can retain for a lifetime. While working for FUSE you will be working with children and young people aged 8 years and over across all sites which may include some outreach and offsite trips.

Working hours

Working hours will vary but each employee will be required to do a minimum of 8hrs per week at your agreed hourly rate.

Any other short form course that can be provided through FUSE YOUTH PROJECT, will help gain sufficient experience in working with young people. Plus, provide opportunities, full time job opportunities.

Responsibilities

- ✂ Assess the needs of young people to correctly plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, gangs, violence, relationships and bullying.
- ✂ Run arts-based activities, community/environmental projects, residential activities, outdoor education and sporting activities procedures.
- ✂ Support young people in different settings, including outreach work and offsite trips
- ✂ Mentor, coach and support individuals, encouraging greater social inclusion
- ✂ Work in partnership with professionals from other organisations that support young people such as social care, health, police, education, youth offending teams and local authorities
- ✂ Work with parents and community groups to win support for improved provision and act as an advocate for young people's interests
- ✂ Set up equipment and pack down each session
- ✂ Complete session plans when advised to by your youth leader
- ✂ Fill in forms on behalf of young people, or assist the to complete forms i.e. feedback and registration forms
- ✂ You may be required to attend training and other meetings to do with your work both paid and expenses paid only.
- ✂ Sign in young people when they arrive at the youth club

- ✂ Play games with young people in order to engage and build trusting relationships
- ✂ Provide information and support to young people to assist them to express and realise their goals and to work effectively in groups.
- ✂ Challenge oppressive behaviour in young people. ✂ Respect confidentiality and follow policy guidelines
- ✂ Encourage young people to broaden their horizons and be active citizens.
- ✂ Support young people in their understanding of risk and challenge and in taking action to address key issues in their lives.

Skills required

- ✂ Basic cooking and art and crafts skills
- ✂ Have a knowledge of Excel
- ✂ Be confident in talking to young people
- ✂ Understanding of different cultures, religions and UK minority groups
- ✂ Creative in sports & play
- ✂ Understanding of young people's health and wellbeing needs
